





The RJ02, designed by Ray Jessop, started off as a project by Ron Dennis and Neil Trundle who were planning a move up to GP racing for their Rondel-Motul F2 team. After failing to secure sponsorship (Motul went to BRM) they backed away and handed the project over to Tony Vlassopoulos and Ken Grob who renamed it Token. Trundle, Jessop, Andy England and Chris Lewis completed the build at their workshop in Walton. It was a simple, neat design making use of a Cosworth DFV coupled to a Hewland FG400 gearbox. Tom Pryce made his Grand Prix debut at the 1974 Belgian GP at Nivelles where he qualified in 20th position out of 32 entries. He was running midfield and suffered from fuel starvation issues at the moment when Jody Scheckter was trying to lap him. He was eliminated when Scheckter could not avoid hitting the Token's left front wheel, breaking the suspension.
