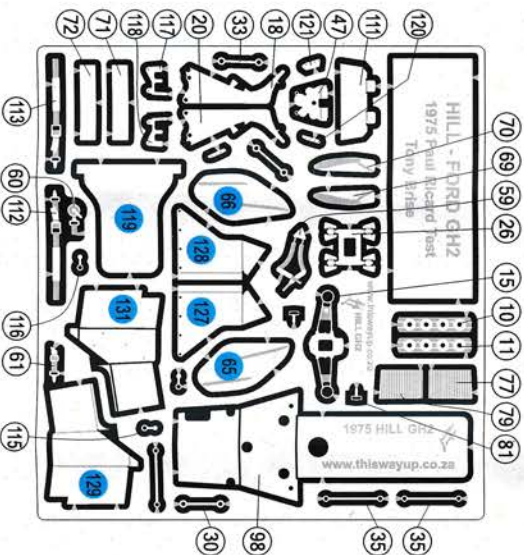
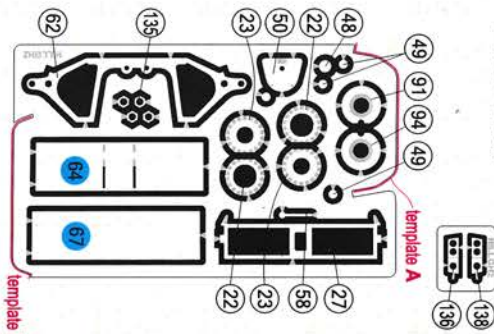

For the 1976 Formula 1 season Andy Smallman designed the Hill GH2. The car had a distinctive pyramid shape and was neatly finished in the red and white colours of the Embassy Racing Team. It was powered through the Ford DFV / Hewland FG400 engine and gearbox combination. Towards the end of the 1975 season, Tony Brise tested the car at Silverstone and despite new car issues it showed great promise. Unfortunately it never raced. The team was wound up following the plane accident that claimed the lives of Graham Hill, Tony Brise and Andy Smallman en route from testing the car at Paul Ricard.
